FROM THE PRESIDENT

Firstly, a sincere thank you to our members for your wonderful support throughout the year. The belief and loyalty you continue to show have helped drive a genuine shift within our club, both on and off the field.

2025 was a year of real momentum for the Perth Football Club. On the field, we delivered moments our community has waited a generation to feel again. Our first senior finals win in 28 years was more than a breakthrough; it was a statement. It signalled that belief is turning into performance, and performance into sustained momentum. Across our men's and women's programmes, across every grade, we witnessed growth, resilience and unity. The energy around the club is different now. The Demons are on the rise.

Football Direction:

Our football direction has never been clearer. Senior men's coach Mark Stone continues to elevate our standards, game style and identity, helping build a programme that is disciplined, well prepared and competitive every week. Football Manager Brad Dodd has strengthened our list with purpose and clarity, bringing in players who reflect the values and direction of the Perth Football Club.

Sandover and Butcher medallist Charlie Constable has shown immense leadership, setting high standards for his teammates on and off the field. Alongside Corey Byrne and the leadership group, he has helped establish a culture of accountability and professionalism.

Premiership coach Steph Walding is leading a strong and united women's programme that continues to grow in depth and ambition. I also want to acknowledge the tremendous work done by inaugural WAFLW coach Jess Sedunary and club legend Robert Wiley, whose leadership and guidance were instrumental in last season's historic achievements. Their contribution laid the groundwork for the women's programme we are now proudly building.

The club now spans five teams with a shared direction, purpose and belief. That alignment is one of our greatest strengths.

Commercial Growth and Financial Reality:

Off the field, we reached an important milestone by raising more than 1 million in partnerships and sponsorships. This achievement reflects the work of our CEO, his team and the directors who continue to strengthen our network. It also demonstrates the growing confidence that sponsors and partners have in the club's future.

At the same time, football remains an expensive industry. Like all WAFL and AFL programmes, our costs continue to rise. Medical and physiotherapy demands have increased significantly. Our women's programme requires ongoing investment to remain competitive and to meet league requirements. Our men's football programme continues to grow and evolve. Facilities and infrastructure also remain a major pressure point.

Despite achieving record commercial support, the club will record a five figure loss this year. It is a reminder that growth on the field must be matched by strong and sustainable growth off it. This is why we are calling on everyone who loves the Perth Football Club to stand with us. With success comes opportunity, but right now we need our community behind us more than ever. If you have friends, colleagues or family who share a connection to the red and black, now is the time to bring them back.

A Club Preparing for Its Next Phase:

We have taken important steps to strengthen our governance, introducing robust Board committees across governance, finance, football, commercial development and facilities. These committees will help guide the club confidently into a period of growth, ensuring that decision making is strategic, measured and in line with our long term ambitions.

Lathlain Park Redevelopment:

The redevelopment of Lathlain Park remains unfinished, despite 14 million in secured funding. Our women and girls continue to use 1950's facilities with one toilet, one urinal, no privacy and five teams sharing rooms built for three. This is simply not acceptable. Parents are rightly concerned, and so are we.

The State Government is ready to move, and we thank Minister Rita Saffioti for her leadership and willingness to engage. This issue is about dignity, safety and fairness. Our players and community deserve better, and we remain committed to working constructively to deliver a modern, fit for purpose home that meets today's standards.

FROM THE CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER

The 2025 season has been a significant and historic year for the Perth Football Club. It has been a year of transition, improvement, and the beginning of a new era across the men's and women's football programs, administration, and community.

In our men's program, we saw substantial transformation with the appointment of Senior Coach Mark Stone and General Manager of Football, Brad Dodd. These changes in personnel helped drive a season of genuine progress. The team recorded eleven wins, finished with a percentage above 100, and most pleasing delivered the Club's first finals victory in 28 years at Good Grocer Park (Shark Park) in front of more than 5,800 fans. It was a proud and unforgettable occasion for everyone connected to the Perth Football Club. And to cap off a successful year, Charlie Constable claimed the pinnacle individual honour in WA football, securing the Sandover Medal, with Brodie Gray also receiving the Prendergast Medal.

A major milestone for the Club was the introduction of our WAFLW team in its inaugural season. This achievement follows years of planning and stands as one of the more important developments in our recent history. The team delivered three memorable wins and became the first expansion club to record a victory. This is an accomplishment the club, players, and staff can be proud of and provides a strong foundation for the growth of our women's program.

Across both programs, it was pleasing to see the energy return to Mineral Resources Park. Our profile recruits performed strongly, while our emerging young players continued to progress through the Club's development pathways and contribute at league level.

Administratively, 2025 marked an important period of modernisation. We rolled out new point of sale technology, migrated our finance systems from MYOB to Xero, and implemented new digital tools to improve financial reporting and operational efficiency with new Finance manager Dee Brooks, instrumental to this process. We'd also like to acknowledge and thank SW Accountants led by John Dorazio, who provided valuable assistance in coordinating the migration to Xero.

Another major project was the transition to the Intix membership platform. This was a significant undertaking, and I acknowledge the considerable work undertaken by Memberships Manager, Cathrine Parker in leading this change. As with any new system, challenges have emerged, and over the coming period we will continue to refine and improve the platform to enhance the member experience.

Our staff have also played an essential role in the progress made this year. As a small not for profit organisation, our people regularly go beyond traditional roles and responsibilities to ensure the Club continues to operate at a high standard. Their commitment, versatility, and genuine care for the Perth Football Club are fundamental to our Club success.

The Club's financial position requires careful attention. Although the end of year concluded with a challenging financial result, we have a clear understanding of the areas that need focus to ensure long term success. Investment in the women's program, people, system upgrades, and operational improvements have contributed to the current position. Our priority now is to strengthen revenue, increase efficiencies, and ensure disciplined expenditure management.



On a positive note, I would like to congratulate the Centurions Fund on another successful year, with the balance now growing beyond 700k, which is truly remarkable. I would also like to thank the trustees for their ongoing support, which remains important to the long term success of the fund.

Community engagement remained a major focus in 2025. Under Community Engagement Manager, Riley Wills, we delivered programs such as Aussie Fit, Wheelchair Football in the WA All Abilities, school visits, and the Free Kick Program.

Our partnership with the Banjima community continued to strengthen and grow, supporting player welfare initiatives and creating meaningful social impact across both the Perth Football Club and Banjima communities. This collaboration enhanced cultural understanding, provided greater support for young Indigenous players, and helped deliver programs that promote connection, education, and wellbeing. The relationship remains a key pillar of our community focus, ensuring that our work together has lasting benefit for players, families, and the wider community.

The Club is grateful for the unwavering support of our commercial partners. Provident Capital Partners - Gavin Caudle, Hungry Jack's - Sam Morton, New Town Toyota - Joe Zito, Westral - Albert Walmsley, and Macmahon Holdings - Micheal Finnegan, along with all the other corporate partners, provide vital support that underpins our operations and growth. From local businesses to major companies, their contributions remain essential to our future.



I would also like to acknowledge our past players and officials for their continued support of the club, providing vital assistance whenever required, whether behind the bar, on game days, or at events. They consistently step into the roles that are the most challenging to cover, and their commitment to the Perth Football Club should never be underestimated.

Finally, I thank the Board of Directors for their guidance and support during my first year as Chief Executive Officer which has been invaluable as we navigate this period of growth and change.

The momentum created in 2025, positions the Perth Football Club strongly for the future. As we move into 2026, our focus is on consolidating the progress made this year, strengthening both our men's and women's programs, and delivering positive outcomes for our members, partners, and wider community.

After close to 30 years since winning a final and almost 50 years since winning a Premiership, the Demons are back where they belong and on the hunt for Premiership number 8.

With a new Senior Coach, as well as a number of other changes and additions, we went into season 2025 with a level of confidence and excitement with our young group. We felt the talent was there, but being able to execute and deliver week in, week out to win enough games to make finals was the unknown.

After a full football department review, we made a number of changes to our Strength and Conditioning team - bringing in Jye Welch from East Fremantle to head up our program. From a Medical point of view - we added Shane Troy to head up our Physio team and Dr Jackson Patterson-House as our Team Doctor. From a coaching point of view - we brought in Brisbane Premiership player, Ash McGrath as our Backs Coach and recently retired Demon, Trent Manzone, as a Development Coach. Trent Barrett, Matt Burgess and Pat Litherland continued in their previous roles.

Recruiting wise, we identified some areas in the squad we felt we needed to boost and went about targeting players. Mark Stone, Adrian Barich, Russ Clark, myself and others explored every lead and opportunity that was presented our way. We spoke to, directly or indirectly, over 70 players. In the end we addressed most of our needs and felt we'd strengthened our Midfield with the additions of Brandan Parfitt and Michael Randall, added to our Small Forwards cartel with Conrad Williams, Tyrone Thorne and Loch Paton, introduced a developing ruck in Tristan Jacques and added to our small backs group with Zac Fleiner. We felt the loss of Joe Chaplin was covered with the addition of Zac Derksen. While we didn't get everything we were after we were happy with the additions we made.

We had a number of players move on at the end of the 2024 season and through the early months of 2025. This is to be expected when there's a changing of the guard and new opinions are forming and opportunities decreasing. Retiring were Trent Manzone and Kristian Cary, while Charlie Thompson moved back home to Victoria. Jye Clark, Sam Stubbs, Jacob Coniglio and Jack Avery moved on for other opportunities. A number of players that have been around for a while and yet to establish themselves as regular League players were let go. Time and games would be invested in a younger, hungrier crop. It's a necessary evil of football, but an important part in building a squad from scratch.

We spent our pre-season training between Min Res Park and Aquinas College. When the players returned in January, we had a day camp at Aquinas - combining a gruelling training session, with an Amazing Race styled-race through the school, topped off with lunch and a values session. Setting the values is the cornerstone for any successful team - and the players came up with 3 core values that they would forever judge themselves against. We got through pre-season relatively healthy - in the practice matches, we had a good first up performance against Peel before a tight loss against Swan Districts. Going into Round 1 we only had Kane Johnston, Sam Simpson, Jack Poole and Regan Clarke unavailable through injury, while Aaron Clarke missed through a family commitment.

We went into Round 1 confident against a strong SF side and led at 3/4 time only to go down by 2 goals. Twice in the last quarter SF had threatened to blow the game wide open and twice we managed to drag ourselves back into the game. We were disappointed but showed some positive signs. We then travelled to Joondalup for a Rd 2 clash against the Falcons - at a venue where there'd been little success for Perth for over 20 years.



FOOTBALL MANAGER'S REPORT 2025

In a gritty performance, we led for most of the night and held off a desperate WP to notch up our first win for the season. It was a challenge that we met head on - a theme that would carry on through the season.

After 5 games we were 4-1 and sitting inside the Top 5. A poor 2nd half saw EF beat us easily before we responded the following week against Peel. It would be a pattern throughout the season - we never lost 2 games in a row. The State bye break came at a good time - with Aussie Davis and Aaron Clarke rewarded for good early season form playing their roles in WAs impressive win over SA. We were up and down in the next block of games - heading into our mid season bye with a 7-3 record but with a critical 4 game stretch ahead. After the bye we met SF again, again we stayed in the game before a last quarter flurry saw us close within 2 goals with an opportunity to make it 1 - only for us to not capitalise and lose by 4 goals. SF were clearly the benchmark of the WAFL but we'd shown in both games that we weren't far away. We next beat EF in a 3 point thriller - just playing a tough, determined brand which was good enough to get the 4 points. We then had our poorest performance for the year against EP - an 80 point flogging at Sullivan Logistics. The 4th game was a tight affair against a desperate Swan Districts - the Black Ducks leading for most of the game before a last quarter scoring flurry saw us come away with a 2 goal win. Going into the last block of games we were 9-5 and 2 wins away from locking in finals. The downside to the win was we lost Regan Clarke, Zac Derksen, Brodie McLean and Oscar Hine-Baston to season ending injuries. The depth would be tested.

Off the bye, we ran into a resurgent WP and dropped a game at home that we had to win - in the end that cost us 3rd position and a double chance. We then beat Peel in Mandurah before one of the most remarkable games I've witnessed - a 9 goal assault in the 1st quarter against Claremont and 50 point lead which was whittled away by half time. The Tigers got the job done from there with a 2 goal win. Despite the frustration of the loss - it reinforced that our best football was good enough to trouble anyone. We then finished the season with a sloppy win over Subiaco in a bit of a shoot out - but we would be playing finals for the first time since the COVID 2020 season, and 2nd time since 1997 - the last time we won a final.

We finished 5th on percentage (equal 3rd on points) and would meet EF at Good Grocer Park in the Elimination Final. After a good start, the Sharks got on top and opened up a 4 goal lead in the 2nd quarter and threatened to stretch the margin further. But once again we dug in - responding and with a Blake Schlenzog goal on the half time siren, we had closed the gap to 5 points. The 3rd quarter was one of those quarters we had shown we had in us all year - a blistering display from the midfield that allow express entry Inside 50 to a functioning and presenting forward line. It was 6 goals to 2 and a handy 20 point lead going into the last. EF responded, perennial finalists over the past 4 seasons, and closed the gap to 2 goals - with the ball living in their half of the ground. A desperate 15 minutes of football was broken by a Blake Schlenzog goal before goals to Cooper Moore and Loch Paton put the game to bed. In front of 6000 people, Perth had won their first final in 28 years. Another challenge met.

The next week, we met another experienced finals campaigner in Claremont, who wouldn't be ambushed a second time. Kicking into the breeze, Claremont held us scoreless in the first quarter and opened up a 4 goal lead at half time. We tried to rally in the 3rd quarter and closed within 2 goals but the Tigers weren't going away and ran out 39 point winners in a spiteful contest. Our season was over - one full of positives but also a clearer perspective on where we needed to improve and get better going forward.

There are a lot of people who put time in over a football season and I can't thank them enough for their efforts. Firstly, our Senior Coach Mark Stone, who has embraced all that is Perth and is unrelenting in his drive to make the club relevant again. Mark is a tireless worker who is unwavering in pushing the program into the high-performance realm.

To our band of coaches: Ash McGrath, Trent Barrett, Matt Burgess, Trent Manzone, Craig Mueller, Pat Litherland and Peter Sumich, who have worked tirelessly over the season to prepare the players and push them to perform at their best. Our young Reserves side also had a successful campaign, making the finals and uncovering plenty of talent who should push for League football over the coming season.

I'd also like to thank our League Bench team, which included Matt Burgess, Jye Welch, Sam Simpson and Regan Clarke on rotations, Runner Ben Thomas, our Strength and Conditioning coach, Jye Welch and our outstanding medical and support team in Shane Troy (Physio), Zac Olsen (Physio), Dr Jackson Patterson-House, Dr Mithun Sri Ganeshan, Head Trainer Imogen Stone and her squad of hard working trainers. Thanks to Mark Ward for his help on the Reserves bench and Chris Brehaut for his help in the box.

Thanks again to our Property team and Team Managers: Doug Ransted, Kevin Dack, Paul Lott and Peter Boyd who are always reliable - ensuring every player is accounted for and kitted and everything needed is on hand. Thanks to our timekeepers - Simon Collins, Clive Mariano and Brian Carr - diehard Demon supporters playing their part.

Congratulations to Scott Moore and his staff on a positive season for the Colts. There are a number of Colts players coming up to the Senior program in 2026, while Koby Evans made his League debut for Perth in 2025, before being drafted to Brisbane at the season's end. Thanks also to Talent Manager, Darren Denneman, who has been a valuable acquisition to the club. We need to service our zone better and identify and put work into our players earlier and Darren is driving the change.

Well done to Dan Elhaj (Women's Football Manager), Jess Sedunary, Rob Wiley (Head Coaches), the WAFLW staff and players on an exciting first season in the WAFLW League competition. It was fantastic to see the improvement every week and to win 3 games and become competitive against most teams has set the foundation for the team for the upcoming season. I know the program, under new coaches Steph Walding (WAFLW) and Tiff Ferguson (Rogers) are driving the girls hard as they endeavour to challenge for finals in 2026.

Thanks to Adrian Barich and the Board for their support over the year. A lot of good decisions were made to get us to this point and that's something that probably goes unrewarded. Special thanks to outgoing CEO, Russ Clark, for being a pivotal part in getting me to the club. Thanks also to new CEO, Jared Bell, who has supported all the programs and is a person who makes things happen. Thanks also to our admin staff - Cath Parker, Ollie Watkins, Brandan Parfitt, Sam Stubbs, Riley Wills, Jill Green, Ben Jeakings, Josh Merrett and Rox Hannay - who work tirelessly across a number of different roles.

Congratulations to all the award winners at the Butcher Medal night. Charlie Constable capped off an outstanding individual year by winning the Sandover Medal and his first Butcher Medal - edging out good friend, Brandan Parfitt and rising star, Elijah Scoble. Connor Sing was a worthy winner of the Trademark Award, in honour of Dakota Baldwin-Wright and voted by the playing group after every game. Nyika John won the Reserves equivalent. Preston Cherry-Bayles won the Reserves Best and Fairest Medal. The 19 year old adjusted to Senior football quickly and is likely to push for Senior selection in 2026. Seth Clark - another impressive talent coming through - won the Colts Best and Fairest.

We head into 2026 full of optimism but realising the jump from 4th to 1st is going to be twice as hard as the jump we've just made. We will all be working hard to ensure we are focused on the things we can control and making sure we take that next step. Though there were some milestones ticked off in 2025, far more challenging ones await in 2026 - we all can't wait!

Overview

The 2025 season marked a significant and progressive year for the Perth Football Club's Women's Program. With our inaugural WAFLW campaign completed, and continued development within the Rogers Cup and Development pathways, the Club is now firmly positioned to strengthen its long-term female talent structure. The year demonstrated both growth and stability across all levels, offering a strong platform for the future.

Rogers Cup Program

The Rogers Cup squad experienced a season of resilience and evolution, maintaining a competitive standard while simultaneously contributing key talent to the Club's inaugural WAFLW campaign. Despite regularly elevating players to the senior program, the squad secured six wins and demonstrated consistent improvement across all phases of the year. In total, 38 players represented the Club at Rogers Cup level, an encouraging indicator of the depth within our pathway and the strength of our youth development model.

We extend our thanks to Head Coach Ash Rohde, who led the program with professionalism and care. He was supported by assistant coaches Emma O'Driscoll, Courtney Rowley, Janelle Marangon, Natalie Limbert and Katie Ashton, along with Team Manager Aleisha Bain and Strength and Conditioning Coach Lachlan Denney, all of whom contributed to ensuring a stable and well-resourced environment.

A special acknowledgement is extended to Katie Ashton, who also led the Development Squad. The program delivered an outstanding outcome, winning all three of its matches and providing clear evidence of the emerging talent that will flow into our Rogers Cup programs in the years ahead.

The Rogers Cup Best and Fairest was awarded to Jessica Green, whose consistency, competitiveness, and leadership were reflected across a strong individual season. Her contribution to the program has set an excellent standard for her peers and future players.

WAFLW Program

The Club's inaugural WAFLW season was an historic milestone and a defining moment in Perth's long-term commitment to female football.

The team recorded its first-ever WAFLW victory and went on to secure three wins across the season, an achievement unmatched by any previous expansion club in its debut year. The squad's development was evident through improved cohesion, increased competitiveness, and a growing ability to match established WAFLW sides. A total of thirty-five players represented the Club at WAFLW level, reflecting both opportunity and depth within the program.

The foundations of the inaugural season were established under Jessica Sedunary, whose leadership, strategic direction, and cultural influence helped set high standards across both performance and professionalism. Jess returned to Adelaide mid-season for the birth of her first child, and the Club acknowledges the significant imprint she left on the program.

Following Jess' departure, Club legend Rob Wiley stepped in to guide the group through the remainder of the season. His experience, calm leadership, and connection to the Perth Football Club were instrumental in ensuring a smooth transition and a strong finish to the year.

The program was further supported by assistant coaches Ross Clark, Shane Jez, Jaide Britton, and Amy Franklin, along with Head of High Performance Mitch Searston, Head Trainer Eleasha Donovan, Head Physio Sara Wetter, Trainer and S&C Dylan Newman, and Team Manager Kira-Lee Johnson. Together, this group delivered a professional and well-structured environment throughout the season.

The inaugural WAFLW Best and Fairest was awarded to Isabella Shannon, who delivered a season of the highest calibre. Her outstanding year was further recognised at league level, where she placed second in the Dhara Kerr Medal count.

State Representatives

The Perth Football Club is proud to recognise the athletes who represented Western Australia in the 2025 State Programs. Their selection is a testament to their talent, commitment, and the strength of the Club's development pathway.

At State 15s level, Maddi Hadrill, Amiria Kingi, and Eva Dixey were selected following strong performances across their community season.

In the State 16s, Matilda Power and Monet Cannon earned selection and continued to strengthen the Club's representation in the youth pathway. The Club's presence in the State 18s program was particularly notable, with Mia Carlshausen, Addison Opalinski, Sienna Timmermans, and Mel Grage all chosen for the squad. A special acknowledgement is extended to Mia Carlshausen, who received selection into the prestigious AFL National Academy, representing a significant achievement for both the player and the Club.

The Club is also pleased to recognise our WAFLW State Team representatives, with Fina Dethlefsen and Isabella Shannon both selected to represent Western Australia at senior level during the year.

2026 Coaching Appointments

Looking ahead, the Club is pleased to confirm that Steph Walding has been appointed as WAFLW Head Coach for the 2026 season, bringing strong experience and leadership into the role. Additionally, Tiffany Ferguson-Blight has been appointed as Rogers Cup Head Coach, providing expertise, and a strong understanding of our pathway and emerging talent.

These appointments represent an important step in strengthening the Club's coaching structure and ensuring ongoing stability and advancement within both programs.

In a night of high drama, a best on ground performance in the final game of the home and away season clinched the 2025 Sandover Medal for Perth midfielder Charlie Constable.

The star Demon is the first player from the club to win the WAFL'S highest individual award since Aidan Tropiano in 2015, finishing on 29 votes, two clear of South Fremantle's Matthew Parker.

Constable picked up three votes from the umpires in the Round 20 match against Subiaco, while Parker, who led the count by one vote heading into the final round, didn't play for the Bulldogs against the West Coast Eagles due to soreness.

Constable was honoured to etch his name into WAFL folklore.

The Perth midfielder produced a dominant start to the season, polling in nine of the first 10 rounds, including four best of ground performances to lead the count with 20 votes at the halfway mark.

Constable averaged more than 30 disposals during the season in a year when Perth qualified for the finals for only the second time this century.

"It means a lot, I'm obviously pretty proud of the season I had," Constable said.

"In the second half of the year, I definitely had a lot more attention and I had to find a way through but overall I'm proud of the season, both individually and as a club."

Parker emerged as the leading challenger to Constable in the back half of the year, collecting four best on grounds between Rounds 13 to 19.

The Bulldogs goalkicking midfielder led by one vote with one round remaining but missed the final game of home and away season.

Constable, who spent six years in the AFL system with Geelong and Gold Coast, joined the Demons in 2024 and recently re-signed with the club until 2027.

As well as the Sandover, the Demons' very own Brodie Gray took out the Prendergast Medal in the Reserves.

The 2025 season was an important year for the Perth Football Club's Colts and Talent Program, highlighted by strong development, increased depth, and a highly committed coaching and support team driving clear standards across the program.

Preseason began with ninety-six invited players at Mills Park for a demanding block of training centred on fitness, skill development, and building early connection within the group.

A key feature of the program was the camp at Gilbert Downs in York, which played a significant role in shaping team culture for the year ahead. During the camp, the group established the values of ruthless, united, and believe. These values guided performance standards throughout the season. The theme of punching your ticket was introduced to reinforce accountability, requiring players to meet clear behaviour and preparation benchmarks to earn selection.

Across the season, fifty-seven players represented our club at Colts level, including several Futures players who stepped up and performed strongly. On field the team produced a competitive and balanced year, playing 16 matches for 8 wins and 8 losses. The season concluded with an exact percentage of 100, with 1,000 points scored and 1,000 points conceded, highlighting the tightly contested nature of the year.

The Club extends its appreciation to the staff and volunteers who contributed to the success of the program. Special thanks go to Steve Ransted and the property team for their ongoing reliability and support at all sessions and match days.

Their work ensured the program operated efficiently throughout the season. Thanks to Associate Director Damian McCague for his continued advocacy at board level and his commitment to ensuring the program was appropriately supported.

Our medical team of Shun Ikeda, Lucas Abbs, and Ciara Mahon provided consistent care and were present at every training session and game. Their work played an essential role in keeping our players available and prepared. The strength and conditioning component delivery was of a high standard by Will Borger and Anthony Gugliotta.

Will built and executed a full program for the first time and delivered it with outstanding detail and energy. Anthony, contributed significant value through his data and performance analysis, setting a benchmark for this level.

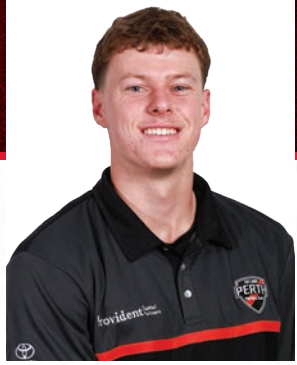

His knowledge, professionalism, and vision will be instrumental in shaping the next phase of our talent programs and driving long term success for the Perth Football Club.

Most importantly, the Club recognises the players for their commitment, resilience, and desire to improve. The group faced challenges throughout the season but remained connected and continued to develop as footballers and young men. Many are now well positioned to progress into senior football, which remains a key measure of the success of our talent pathway.

Finally, the Club extends its sincere thanks to outgoing Colts Coach Scott Moore, for his dedication and leadership. Scott has served the Perth Football Club for 10 years following his playing career, contributing across the talent pathway, and making a lasting impact on the development of young footballers. He leaves with the respect and appreciation of the entire Club and will always be regarded as a valued member of the Perth family. We thank him for his commitment, passion, and service and wish him every success in the future.





FROM THE COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT MANAGER

In 2025, Perth Football Club (PFC) continued to strengthen its community presence across both metropolitan and regional zones, supported by our major sponsor Hungry Jack's and valued partners Fugro and Macmahon. Through a wide range of initiatives, we expanded engagement, supported the development of local talent, and promoted the spirit of the game at every level. Our work this year reflects PFC's ongoing commitment to building strong connections and delivering meaningful outcomes for the community.

The Free Kick Program returned for its fourth year, once again providing regional youth with the opportunity to connect, learn and grow through football. Across four-week programs in Dowerin/Goomalling and Moora, more than 70 participants aged 8–16 took part, with strong female representation and outstanding Indigenous involvement. Football clinics focused on developing core skills in a fun, supportive environment, while education sessions promoted healthy eating, exercise, goal setting, and anti-vaping. Shared dinners and player involvement further strengthened connections. In addition, one-day clinics in Northam, Dongara, and Dalwallinu engaged more than 60 children, ensuring even more young people had the chance to experience football in a positive and inclusive setting.

Our partnership with Penrhos College continued to thrive in 2025, providing meaningful opportunities for students to develop their skills and engage with the game. Six senior PFC players, Noah Cachard, Elijah Scoble, Loch Mactaggart, Jorja Haines, Lauren Davey, and Paige Bower—coached Term 1 IGSSA Football teams, actively supporting both training and game day environments.

Their focus on enjoyment and skill development created a rewarding experience for students. Importantly, the involvement of PFC women's players not only strengthened the connection with students but also provided inspiring role models for aspiring female footballers. To further extend the program, PFC facilitated weekly clinics for Grades 3–6 in Term 3, focusing on skill acquisition and fundamentals. With the launch of our senior women's team in the WAFLW competition in 2025, the female pathway is now complete, offering a clear progression from Rogers Cup (U18) through to senior football.

The Wheelchair Football Team, after historic premiership wins in 2022 and 2023, entered the 2024 season chasing a three-peat. Despite a hard-fought campaign, the team fell just short in the Grand Final against the West Coast Eagles. A major focus in 2024 was boosting competition visibility, achieved through regular social media coverage and original content, as well as the release of a short documentary highlighting the inclusive environment and community spirit of wheelchair football. These initiatives attracted greater attention and strengthened awareness of the program. Looking ahead, the 2025 season kicks off on 28 September with new playing kits designed by captain Toby Ancombe's brand, Awareness Apparel. With renewed energy, the team is determined to bounce back and reclaim the premiership.

PFC also delivered school clinics across more than 30 schools in 2025, working closely with WA Football Participation Officer, Josh Merrett. This important partnership helped us expand our reach and ensured the Perth spirit was spread widely throughout our community.





Senior men's players, alongside our Community Engagement Manager, enhanced the experience by running interactive sessions, providing giveaways, taking photos, and answering student questions. These clinics not only introduced children to football in a fun and inclusive way but also strengthened PFC's connection with schools, families, and the wider community.

In 2025, PFC continued to strengthen its connection with junior clubs across our metropolitan catchment through player appearances at training sessions and registration days, half-time mini matches at League games supported by WA Football, and invitations for junior club committees to attend pre-game President's Lunches. These initiatives provided young players with memorable experiences, role models to look up to, and a greater sense of belonging within the football community. They also helped celebrate the important role volunteers and club leaders play in sustaining grassroots football. By fostering these relationships, PFC ensures a strong pathway from junior to senior football and reinforces the spirit of community across all levels of the game.

In 2024, PFC partnered with Curtin University and The Heart Foundation to deliver the Aussie-FIT program, a free 12-week initiative designed to help men make positive lifestyle changes such as improving eating habits, increasing physical activity, and achieving healthy weight loss. The program focuses on education to ensure these changes can be sustained well beyond the 12 weeks. As part of the partnership, Curtin University trained PFC players to facilitate the program. In 2024, Kieren Pettit and Riley Wills led delivery, and in 2025, Noah Murray has joined Riley to continue this important work. Each program involves 12 x 90-minute sessions that combine an educational component with structured physical activity. The most recent two programs proved highly successful, creating a strong team environment that empowered participants to support one another and achieve their goals.

Feedback highlighted not only the physical benefits but also the camaraderie and sense of community developed throughout the sessions. With continued growth, Aussie-FIT remains a key initiative in promoting health and wellbeing across the PFC community.

Perth Football Club's connection with the Banjima community continued to grow through a strong, mutually supportive partnership. Banjima's sponsorship has enabled PFC to enhance its community presence with new co-branded giveaways and has played a major role in supporting the women's program as well as broader community initiatives. In return, PFC actively gives back by sponsoring awards at Cecil Andrews College—where many Banjima students attend—and by hosting dedicated football clinics at the club, including sessions on the main oval followed by shared meals to encourage connection. The club also supports the Banjima community during their AGM by running engaging football activities for the children, helping create a fun, welcoming environment and further strengthening ties between the two communities.

In 2025, Perth Football Club meaningfully deepened its impact across local and regional communities by expanding inclusive programs, strengthening partnerships, and providing clear pathways for participation at every level of the game. Through initiatives such as the Free Kick Program, school clinics, junior club engagement, the Penrhos College partnership, and the continued growth of the Wheelchair Football Team and Aussie-FIT program, PFC fostered environments where young people, families, and adults could connect, learn, and thrive. These efforts not only enhanced access to football across metropolitan and regional areas but also celebrated diversity, supported wellbeing, and built stronger relationships with schools, clubs, and community organisations. Collectively, these initiatives reinforce PFC's commitment to community-first football and ensure a lasting, positive influence throughout its zones.

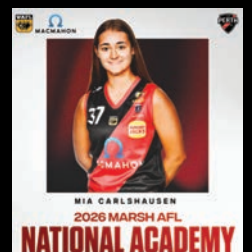

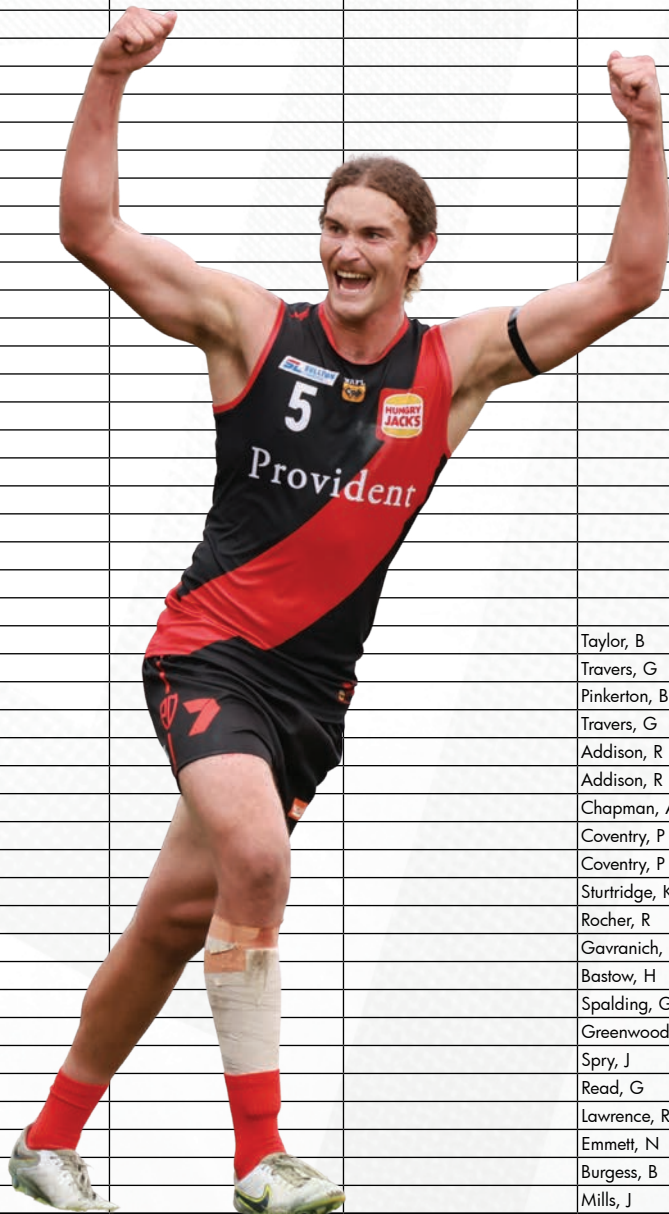
